# The FED Vision

The Assembly Standing Committee sees the role of the Assembly in providing a cohesive national vision:

- Congregations as lifelong learning communities of discipleship for the sake of the mission of God;
- Church leaders as effective educational leaders, capable of guiding a community in forming disciples;
- Congregations developing a culture of learning for and from engagement in mission: mission-shaping discipleship.

According to this vision, the Assembly has a role in promoting Christian education as a distinctive ministry yet also integral to worship, teaching, doctrine, formation, community life and mission.

### What is FED?

In March 2013, the Assembly Standing Committee received the Christian Education Research Report and adopted the following resolution:

13.11.02 To note Assembly minute 00.28.03 (9th Assembly)

To name the teaching ministry as a core function of each council of the church and to affirm that the Assembly has a role in Christian Education.
